Reason for Outpatient Therapy: Traumatic brain injury

Harris Varickappallil's mother was taking an advanced cardiac life support (ACLS) class at PAM Health Rehabilitation Hospital of Tulsa when she saw a photo promoting the EksoHealth robotic exoskeleton. It caught her attention because in March of 2020, her son, Harris, had been in an accident and suffered a traumatic brain injury. At the time she was there for the class, he was still unable to walk, transfer, write, and lift his left arm. While at PAM Health, his mom happened to meet Mike, a PAM Health physical therapist assistant, and asked him if the exoskeleton could help her son. Mike was very helpful and encouraged them to come to PAM Health for outpatient therapy.

Harris began seeing improvements shortly after starting therapy at PAM Health. His mother recalls the happiness they felt when he was able to move his arm, walk using the exoskeleton, write his name, and take steps with the help of a walker and therapist.


"Life was not easy for us. We were mentally, physically, and financially drained," she shared.
